Background

On November 8, 2023, the Board adopted a Resolution of intention to annex the parcel referenced above to the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone. The Public Hearing date was established as January 10, 2024.

Analysis

The District's *Master Resolution Governing Annexations of Territory to the West Bay Sanitary District On-Site Disposal Zone* states: "Pursuant to Section 6959 of the Health and Safety Code, the date of the Public Hearing shall be commenced no less than 45 days nor more than 60 days from the date of adoption of the Resolution of Intention, and the Public Hearing shall be completed no more than 90 days after the first day of the hearing."

In accordance with Section 6960, and 6960.1 of the same code, reviews and reports of findings are required of both the County Health Officer and Regional Water Quality Control Board. Additionally, Section 6960.3 of this code requires the review and approval by a local agency formation commission, which has adopted rules and regulations affecting the functions and services of special districts.

The San Mateo County Health Officer has responded by a letter of approval dated December 18, 2023, a copy of which is attached; the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board responded by a letter of approval dated December 12, 2023, a copy of which is attached; and the San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission has approved per their Resolution No. 1296 dated September 21, 2023, a copy of which is attached.

Fiscal Impact

Property owners have paid all annexation fees, and the fiscal impact would be additional sewer service charge revenue to the District once the parcel is connected.

Recommendation

The Board is asked to close the Public Hearing following public comment.

Dear Bill Kitajima:

The Regional Water Board hereby approves the annexation of the subject parcel to the On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone of the West Bay Sanitary District (District). The property owners applied to the District for annexation "for the purpose of obtaining sewer service for a single-family residence." To connect to existing District sewer facilities, the property owners require a Grinder Pump System that the District must maintain. Therefore, this parcel must be annexed into the District's disposal zone.

The Regional Water Board's approval is conditional upon the District (1) retaining responsibility for operation and maintenance of the grinder pump system, and (2) ensuring the proper operation and maintenance of the other sewerage facilities serving the parcel. Disposal of sewage onto soils within the disposal zone is not approved.





Background

The property will utilize a Grinder Pump system; consequently, this property must be annexed into the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone. The proponent shall be required to install a Grinder Pump system and connect to a WBSD force main (FM) located on Grove Drive.

Analysis

Following the Public Hearing to annex certain territory to the District's On-Site Wastewater District Disposal Zone, the attached resolution would formally complete the annexation of the referenced Lands of Jonathan L. Eng and Joanna Y. Kim.

Fiscal Impact

Property owners have paid all annexation fees, and the fiscal impact would be additional sewer service charge revenue to the District once the parcel is connected.

Recommendation

Subject to the final review by legal counsel and the findings of the resolution holding true through the public hearing (i.e., protests by less than 35 percent of the voters and landholders), it is recommended by the Project Manager that the Board adopt the resolution as drafted.

RESOLUTION NO. _____ (2024)

RESOLUTION ORDERING ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN TERRITORY OF WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT TO THE WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT ON-SITE WASTEWATER DISPOSAL ZONE INCLUDING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS, FINDINGS AND DECLARATIONS OF THE DISTRICT BOARD (LANDS OF JONATHAN L. ENG AND JOANNA Y. KIM)

The District Board of West Bay Sanitary District determines, finds and declares as follows:

- (a) The proceedings, which are the subject of the Resolution, are undertaken pursuant to Chapter 3 of Part 2 of Division 5 (commencing with Section 6950) of the California Health & Safety ("H & S") Code having to do with the formation of, and annexations to, on-site wastewater disposal zones.
- (b) On November 8, 2023 the District Board approved and adopted Resolution No. 2396 (2023), "RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT ON-SITE WASTEWATER DISPOSAL ZONE." Among other things, Resolution No. 2396 (2023) described the area to be annexed to the zone, the name and address of the applicant and the number, type, volume and location of on-site wastewater disposal systems proposed.
- (c) Pursuant to Resolution No. 2396 (2023), a public hearing was noticed in the manner required by H&S § 6958. The public hearing was commenced on January 10, 2024 and closed on January 10, 2024.
- (d) Prior to the close of the hearing, the District Board received and considered reports from the following public officials and agencies as required by law:
 - i. From the Public Health and Environmental Protection Division, Health Services Agency of the County of San Mateo, a letter dated December 18, 2023, constituting the report of the local health officer specifying the matters required by H & S § 6960.1.
 - <u>ii.</u> From the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, a letter dated December 12, 2023 constituting the report of the affected regional water quality control board with regard to the matters required by H & S § 6960.1 and approving the proposed plan for wastewater disposal by the affected regional water quality control board required by H & S § 6960.4.
 - <u>iii.</u> From San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission, a letter by which the commission approved annexation to the District and the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone.

- (e) At all times during the public hearing, the District was prepared to hear and receive any oral or written protests, objections and evidence which might be offered. No oral or written protests, objections or evidence in opposition to the proposal were made, presented or filed at any time. Therefore, pursuant to H & S § 6963, it is determined that written protests filed and not withdrawn prior to the conclusion of the public hearing represented:
 - <u>i.</u> Less than 35 percent of the number of voters who reside in the territory to be annexed to the zone; and
 - <u>ii.</u> Less than 35 percent of the number of owners of real property in the territory to be annexed to the zone who also own not less than 35 percent of the assessed value of real property in the territory to be annexed to the zone.
- (f) The number and types of on-site wastewater disposal systems proposed to be acquired, operated, maintained and monitored in the territory to be annexed to the zone are in conformity with and do not exceed the limitations set forth in the reports referred to (d) <u>i.</u> and <u>ii.</u> above.
- (g) The territory proposed for annexation to the zone contains two (2) voters as defined in the Elections Code.
- (h) Operation of the zone in the territory to be annexed will not result in land uses that are not consistent with general plans, zoning ordinances or other land use regulations of the Town of Portola Valley, the County of San Mateo or any other affected public agency.

In consideration of the foregoing determinations, findings and declarations,

IT IS RESOLVED by the District Board as follows:

- 1. The territory described in Exhibit "A" shall be annexed to the West Bay Sanitary District On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone.
- This annexation shall be accomplished without an election and confirmation of voters within the area to be annexed shall not be required on the question of such annexation.
- 3. The exterior boundaries of the annexation shall include the same territory described in Exhibit "A" to Resolution No. 2396 (2023), which Exhibit "A" is attached to this Resolution and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. There shall be one on-site wastewater disposal system serving one residential user in the territory to be annexed to the zone, which system the District will either acquire, operate, maintain or monitor, as the case may be, all as set forth in Exhibit "B" to Resolution No. 2396 (2023), which Exhibit "B" is attached to this Resolution and incorporated herein by reference.
- 5. Operations of the portions of the zone annexed herein shall be financed by a system of fees and charges imposed upon persons who make use of the on-site wastewater disposal system in the territory annexed to the zone. The fees and charges will be structured to take into account the actual costs of operating and administering the zone and the maintenance, repair and replacement of wastewater facilities within the







Background

On November 8, 2023, the Board adopted a Resolution of intention to annex the parcel referenced above to the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone. The Public Hearing date was established as January 10, 2024.

Analysis

The District's *Master Resolution Governing Annexations of Territory to the West Bay Sanitary District On-Site Disposal Zone* states: "Pursuant to Section 6959 of the Health and Safety Code, the date of the Public Hearing shall be commenced no less than 45 days nor more than 60 days from the date of adoption of the Resolution of Intention, and the Public Hearing shall be completed no more than 90 days after the first day of the hearing."

In accordance with Section 6960, and 6960.1 of the same code, reviews and reports of findings are required of both the County Health Officer and Regional Water Quality Control Board. Additionally, Section 6960.3 of this code requires the review and approval by a local agency formation commission, which has adopted rules and regulations affecting the functions and services of special districts.

The San Mateo County Health Officer has responded by a letter of approval dated December 18, 2023 a copy of which is attached; the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board responded by a letter of approval dated December 12, 2023, a copy of which is attached; and the San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission has approved per their Resolution No. 1308 dated July 19, 2023, a copy of which is attached.

Fiscal Impact

Property owners have paid all annexation fees, and the fiscal impact would be additional sewer service charge revenue to the District once the parcel is connected.

Recommendation

The Board is asked to close the Public Hearing following public comment.



The District Board of West Bay Sanitary District determines, finds and declares as follows:

- (a) The proceedings, which are the subject of the Resolution, are undertaken pursuant to Chapter 3 of Part 2 of Division 5 (commencing with Section 6950) of the California Health & Safety ("H & S") Code having to do with the formation of, and annexations to, on-site wastewater disposal zones.
- (b) On November 8, 2023 the District Board approved and adopted Resolution No. 2395 (2023), "RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE WEST BAY SANITARY DISTRICT ON-SITE WASTEWATER DISPOSAL ZONE." Among other things, Resolution No. 2395 (2023) described the area to be annexed to the zone, the name and address of the applicant and the number, type, volume and location of on-site wastewater disposal systems proposed.
- (c) Pursuant to Resolution No. 2395 (2023), a public hearing was noticed in the manner required by H&S § 6958. The public hearing was commenced on January 10, 2024 and closed on January 10, 2024.
- (d) Prior to the close of the hearing, the District Board received and considered reports from the following public officials and agencies as required by law:
 - i. From the Public Health and Environmental Protection Division, Health Services Agency of the County of San Mateo, a letter dated December 18, 2023, constituting the report of the local health officer specifying the matters required by H & S § 6960.1.
 - ii. From the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, a letter dated December 12, 2023 constituting the report of the affected regional water quality control board with regard to the matters required by H & S § 6960.1 and approving the proposed plan for wastewater disposal by the affected regional water quality control board required by H & S § 6960.4.
 - <u>iii.</u> From San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission, a letter by which the commission approved annexation to the District and the District's On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone.

- (e) At all times during the public hearing, the District was prepared to hear and receive any oral or written protests, objections and evidence which might be offered. No oral or written protests, objections or evidence in opposition to the proposal were made, presented or filed at any time. Therefore, pursuant to H & S § 6963, it is determined that written protests filed and not withdrawn prior to the conclusion of the public hearing represented:
 - <u>i.</u> Less than 35 percent of the number of voters who reside in the territory to be annexed to the zone; and
 - <u>ii.</u> Less than 35 percent of the number of owners of real property in the territory to be annexed to the zone who also own not less than 35 percent of the assessed value of real property in the territory to be annexed to the zone.
- (f) The number and types of on-site wastewater disposal systems proposed to be acquired, operated, maintained and monitored in the territory to be annexed to the zone are in conformity with and do not exceed the limitations set forth in the reports referred to (d) <u>i.</u> and <u>ii.</u> above.
- (g) The territory proposed for annexation to the zone contains two (2) voters as defined in the Elections Code.
- (h) Operation of the zone in the territory to be annexed will not result in land uses that are not consistent with general plans, zoning ordinances or other land use regulations of the Town of Portola Valley, the County of San Mateo or any other affected public agency.

In consideration of the foregoing determinations, findings and declarations,

IT IS RESOLVED by the District Board as follows:

- 1. The territory described in Exhibit "A" shall be annexed to the West Bay Sanitary District On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone.
- 2. This annexation shall be accomplished without an election and confirmation of voters within the area to be annexed shall not be required on the question of such annexation.
- 3. The exterior boundaries of the annexation shall include the same territory described in Exhibit "A" to Resolution No. 2395 (2023), which Exhibit "A" is attached to this Resolution and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. There shall be one on-site wastewater disposal system serving one residential user in the territory to be annexed to the zone, which system the District will either acquire, operate, maintain or monitor, as the case may be, all as set forth in Exhibit "B" to Resolution No. 2395 (2023), which Exhibit "B" is attached to this Resolution and incorporated herein by reference.
- 5. Operations of the portions of the zone annexed herein shall be financed by a system of fees and charges imposed upon persons who make use of the on-site wastewater disposal system in the territory annexed to the zone. The fees and charges will be structured to take into account the actual costs of operating and administering the zone and the maintenance, repair and replacement of wastewater facilities within the

territory annexed to the zone.	The fees and charges will, to the extent applicable,

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

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

- 6. The proposed annexation is for the interest of the landowners and present and future inhabitants within the District and within the said property to be annexed.
- 7. The LAFCo of San Mateo County has adopted Resolution 1296 (Exhibit "B") ordering annexation of the referenced territory to the West Bay Sanitary District.

Subject: General Manager's Report

1) Administrative:

- a. General Counsel delivered the first batch of public records requested by East Palo Alto Sanitary District. The records were also sent to San Mateo County LAFCo and the City of East Palo Alto.
- b. Staff continues to work with Bidnet Direct to implement the online bidding platform. The new bidding platform will be linked to the new website.

2) Finance:

- a. The District has formally submitted for a Title XVI WIIN Act Water Reclamation and Reuse Project Grant from the United States Bureau of Reclamation. The grant application is for \$10 million, and the funds could be used to expand reclaimed water to the City of East Palo Alto, East Menlo Park, and the Fair Oaks Area, including Flood Park.
- b. State Revolving Fund (SRF) staff continues to work on the Bayfront Recycled Water Facility's SRF loan. The SRF loan has been preapproved for \$66.6 million. Approximately \$52 million in a loan and \$14 million as part of a state grant.
- c. The District received the initial annual Sewer Service Charge fees collected by the San Mateo County Tax Collector. The fees equal \$16,166,066.54. The next payment should be received between February and March.

3) CIP Projects:

a. Construction Capital Improvement Program (CIP):

 Ranger Pipelines submitted a revised construction schedule for the Bayfront Improvements Project. The underground pipeline work is scheduled to begin in March.

b. Levee Improvement Project:

i. Anderson Pacific has been working diligently on grading and raising the levee to take advantage of favorable weather and the permitted construction season.

4) Information Technology (IT):

a. Staff provided an update on migrating to the Cloud.

5) Operations and Maintenance:

a. Collection System:

- Only two sanitary sewer spills occurred In the District in 2023. One was due to a force main break on Sand Hill Road in Menlo Park and the other was in a manhole in the Town of Atherton.
- ii. The Source Control crew installed a Smart Cover on Ivy Drive in Menlo Park to monitor water levels within the manhole.

b. Pump Facilities:

i. The pump station crew continues to replace ISAC boards with lights and buzzards to the Private STEP/Grider Systems.

c. Training:

 Maintenance staff received audible testing to establish baselines and check for hearing loss.

6) Water Quality:

a. Sharon Heights Golf and Country Club (SHGCC):

i. Trojan UV bulb replacement was conducted on January 2nd. This is part of a 5-year capital replacement program. The cost was approximately \$35 thousand which included the bulbs and service. The 3-ton crane will be serviced next as well as membrane filters.

b. Bayfront Recycled Water Facility (BRWF):

 The Request for Proposals is nearly complete and will be sent to the qualified contractor.

c. Woodside Recycled Water Facility (WRWF):

 The Woodside Recycled Water Facility feasibility study is nearly complete and will be brought to the Board.

7) Fleet and Facilities:

a. Vehicle Maintenance:

i. The four Electric Vehicles and charging stations are working well.

8) Personnel:

i. Two temporary workers will be hired in the next two months in order to keep up with necessary maintenance schedules.

9) Upcoming Events:

a. Next Regular Board Meetings: Wednesdays January 10th and January 24th

10) Misc. Items:

- a. **West Bay:** The General Manager will update the Board on miscellaneous items related to District operations.
- b. Town of Los Altos Hills: Experienced a total of three sanitary sewer spills in 2023.
- c. **Town of Woodside:** A quarter of the system was video inspected, and the entire system was hydro jetted as scheduled in 2023.

Subject: Ratify Investment Transfer

Background

The resolution to the Investment Policy was updated January 3, 2024 to allow the Finance Committee to recommend transfers to BMO Bank Investment Management & Trust portfolios followed by ratification by the full Board at the next regular board meeting.

On December 13, 2023 at the regular full board meeting, cash and investments were presented with the First Quarter Financial Report Fiscal Year 2023-24. The board recommended the Finance Committee meet and discuss investments further. On December 20, 2024, the Finance Committee met with staff and BMO Investment advisors. By that date, the LAIF balance was \$41.8 million, after the initial 50% deposit from San Mateo County for the sewer service charges on the tax roll. Reserves in the BMO Federated Hermes Government Obligations Fund money market account was \$3.9 million. Based on operating and capital cash flow, it was established that approximately \$20 million could be safely invested short-term to increase yields while U.S. Treasury rates were high.

Fiscal Impact

Following the Finance Committee recommendations, \$20 million was transferred from the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) to BMO Bank Investment Management & Trust Capital Reserve Account. These funds will be invested in short-term treasuries.

The District will increase yields approximately 1.4% immediately by moving the funds from LAIF to the BMO Federated Hermes Government Obligations Fund money market account, which has a yield of 5.37%, as of January 4, 2024 compared to the LAIF 3.96%, as of December 29, 2023. Funds will then be invested as recommended by the Finance Committee, to lock in yields until funds are needed.

Subject: Consider Adopting Resolution Approving Master Fee Schedule

(2024)

Background

The District Board approved an amendment to the Code of General Regulations in August of 2014, removing the Master Fee Schedule, which outlines fees, from the Code of General Regulations and allows the Board to update these fees by resolution as needed to keep pace with inflation etc. The Master Fee Schedule was subsequently updated by resolution for the various District permits in September of 2014, September 2017, January of 2020, and June of 2023. District Staff has worked to develop an updated schedule of District fees that would cover cost of service involved in each rate category for issuing, inspecting, reviewing and enforcing permits and included credit card processing fee.

Analysis

The updated Master Fee Schedule includes a credit card service fee as a pass-through cost based on 3% charged by credit card company for customer who chose to use a credit card. The advantage of a Master Fee Schedule is: a) fees can be updated periodically by Board resolution rather than amend the Code of Regulations; b) it serves as a convenient handout for customers seeking information on permit fees etc.

Fiscal Impact

There is no material fiscal impact with the past-through fee.

Recommendation

The General Manager recommends that the District Board Adopt the Resolution Approving Master Fee Schedule 2024.

Class 1 A - E

The permit and inspection fees for a Class 1 Sewer Permit (open-trench) for service to residential structures shall be \$490.00.

Class 2 A - E

The permit and inspection fees for a Class 2 Sewer Permit (open-trench) for service to non-residential structures shall be \$690.00.

Class 1F and Class 2F

The permit and inspection fees for a Class 1F Sewer Permit (trenchless) for service to residential or non-residential structures shall be \$720.00 plus San Mateo County recording fee.

Class 3

The permit fee for a Class 3 Sewer Permit for construction of sewer mains, pumping stations and other wastewater facilities, shall be \$ 2,660.00.

Class 4A and 4B

The permit and inspection fees for a Class 4 Disconnect Sewer Permit for service to residential or non-residential structures shall be \$220.00.

Class 5 STEP and Grinder

The permit and inspection fees for a Class 5 Sewer Permit for service to residential or non-residential structures shall be \$5,600.00 (mainline extension requires additional Class 3 permit.)

Class 6 - Encroachments (Public Sewer Main and Facilities Access)

The permit and inspection fees for a Class 6 Encroachment Permit for CCTV Sewer Main inspections shall be \$325.00 per project.

Private Job Account: Development and Re-Development Projects

Developer shall submit an initial deposit of \$20,000.00 for plan submittals and review. Developer may be required to supply additional deposit when the initial deposit falls below 25%. Once the project is approved a permit will be required as described above.

Additional or Re-Inspections

\$110.00 per additional inspection or re-inspection.

CCTV Review Only

CCTV Inspection reviews for Sewer Lateral shall be \$110.00 per sewer lateral.

Estimated & Metered Volume Permits

Estimation of discharge for commercial customers shall be \$200.00 upon determination by the General Manager.

Private Wastewater Disposal Permits

\$210.00 for maintaining and operating, or proposes to maintain and operate, a private wastewater disposal system.

Enforcement Hearing.

\$1,500.00 per public hearing.

Plan Review (Projects or Water Quality)

\$140.00 per hour for review by Project Manager or Water Quality Manager.

Charges for Staff Time

Staff salary multiplied by 1.75%.

Charges for District Materials

Cost of materials multiplied by 10%.

Annexation Fee*.

\$655.00 annexation processing fee per parcel;

\$655.00 annexation into the On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone per parcel;

\$2400.00 publication fee per parcel (for annexation into the On-Site Wastewater Disposal Zone)

* Additional fees may be due by other agencies.

Review of Proposals for Accidental Discharges & HMBP's

\$455.00 for any accidental spills or discharges that do not conform to the conditions of a facilities permit or the code must be reported immediately to the POTW and the WBSD. Hazardous Material Business Plan (HMBP): A Business Plan is required when businesses handle and/or stores a hazardous material equal to or greater than the minimum reportable quantities. These quantities are 55 gallons for liquids, 500 pounds for solids and 200 cubic feet (at standard temperature and pressure) for compressed gases. Radioactive materials and extremely hazardous substances are reportable in any amount. The District reviews these plans and inspects facilities to ensure compliance with the District's Code.

Non-Routine Discharge Permit

\$515.00plus treatment fees based on flow and loadings plus SVCW fee of \$50.00.,

Non-routine discharges (slugs) are defined as any quantity of industrial (non-domestic) wastewater that is discharged to the sanitary sewer on less than a daily frequency, and has the potential to cause interference with or pass-through the wastewater treatment plant or collection system.

Ground Water Discharge.

\$515.00 plus treatment fees based on current ccf rate plus SVCW fee of \$436.00 (as of 4/7/14).

Groundwater discharge is defined as the movement of water out of an area of saturated soil, to the sanitary sewer.

Mandatory Wastewater Discharge Compliance Permit (& 5-year Permit Renewal)

\$785.00 plus SVCW fee of \$1,112.00 (as of 4/7/14). Required for chemically treated wastewater to make acceptable for discharge into the sanitary sewer.

Self Monitoring Report (Review)

\$270.00for sampling is performed and the results of the sampling indicate a violation the user shall notify the POTW and the WBSD within 24 hours of becoming aware of the violation.

Discharge Report Review

\$270.00 Discharge report review is defined as a report prepared by industries and other facilities discharging to sanitary sewer. The facilities collect wastewater samples, conduct chemical and/or biological tests of the samples, and submit the reports for review.

Swimming Pool Discharge "Residential".

\$295.00 plus treatment fees based on current ccf rate for discharge of pool in sanitary sewer.

Swimming Pool Discharge "Commercial".

\$295.00 plus treatment fees based on current ccf rate for discharge of pool in sanitary sewer.

FOG Non-Compliance Inspection.

\$220.00 Re-inspection fee for facilities in violation of the Districts Code of General Regulations, Sections 602 & 603

Commercial/Industrial Non-Compliance Inspection.

\$220.00 Re-inspection fee for facilities in violation of the Districts Code of General Regulations, Sections 600, 601, 602, & 603

Flow Meter Operations and Maintenance Fee.

\$595.00 monthly.

Credit Card Service Fee

3% of purchase price plus any additional pass-through fees by cardholder's bank.

BACKGROUND:

Sergio Ramirez was appointed General Manager by the Board of Directors pursuant to an employment agreement that was entered into on May 13, 2020, and has been amended and restated from time to time, most recently by an amended and restated employment agreement (the "Agreement") dated July 13, 2022. Under the terms of the Agreement, the General Manager is eligible for an end-of-year performance payment on or after each January 1st during the term of the Agreement, in the amount of up to fifteen percent of base salary based on the Board of Directors' assessment of performance in meeting the General Manager's goals and objectives for the prior calendar year.

DISCUSSION:

The Board of Directors conducted an annual performance evaluation/compensation review of the General Manager at its regular meeting of December 13th, 2023 and a follow-up performance review on January 3, 2024. Based thereon, the Board directed that an item be agendized for its regular meeting of January 10th to consider, in open session, an annual performance payment in the amount of 13.5 percent of the General Manager's current base salary of \$241,744, which results in a payment of \$32,635.44. California State Law requires that all executive employee compensation decisions must be approved in open session at a regularly scheduled meeting.

Funding for the annual performance payment is included in the FY 2023-24 budget and there are no additional fiscal impacts generated by final approval.
